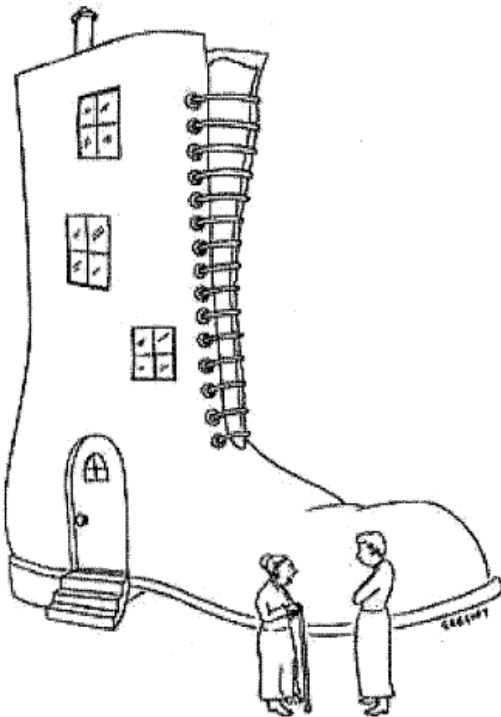

Chief Pete Dunbar Modern Police Technology

Chief Dunbar discussed the improvements in data movement technology and how they benefit officers on the street. Pictures can be retrieved from various data bases to assist officers in the field.

Some cars are equipped with LPR -- "License Plate Reader" -- which can monitor vehicles in a 360 degree radius of the police car. This license plate information is then compared with stolen vehicle reports to help locate missing cars, etc. This prompted the expected question from our group, "So how can we avoid being detected?" (Our Club has no shame.)
